

Prachuap Khiri Khan Province Order No. 5083/2563

Topic: The relaxation of enforcement of some measures concerning the prevention of the Covid-19 Epidemic.

According to the Prime Minister's announcement of the State of Emergency in all areas throughout the kingdom of Thailand as from March 26, 2020 and later extended the enforcement of the Emergency Announcement until May 31, 2020

Whereas it is deemed appropriate to further relax the enforcement of certain measures for the prevention of the spread of the COVID-19 disease in addition to earlier relaxations in order to reduce the impact on the people in terms of the economy, society and security, according to the situation assessment report of the Centre for the Administration of the Situation due to the outbreak of the Communicable Disease Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) and the opinions of those responsible for security, economy, entrepreneurs and consumers, together with the suggestion from those responsible for public health that the cumulative number of infected persons, the number of newly infected persons daily and the statistics of deaths in the country since the beginning of May during the period which the Regulations (No. 4), (No. 5) and (No. 6) are in effect are constantly decreasing or at a controllable level, however since there remain risk factors from weather conditions, the number of cross-provincial travellers and travellers from abroad, as well as certain groups of people who remain negligent and fail to comply with disease prevention measures while the spreading of the disease is still apparent in other countries, the relaxation should therefore be based on the risk exposure of persons, places and types of activities, subject to strict compliance of disease prevention measures and recommendations of the government, and if there is an increased number of infected persons or the risk exposure become higher, such relaxation may be partially or entirely suspended or modified;

Therefore, in order to proceed accordingly with the people in Prachuap Khiri Khan Province and can reduce the impact on the people, economy, society and security, in accordance with the of Regulations under Article 9 of the Emergency Decree B.E. 2548 (No. 7), The governor of Prachuap Khiri Khan Province, by the virtue according to 7(1) of regulation of section 9 of Emergency Decree B.E. 2548 (No 1.), section 35 (1) of Communicable Decrease Act B.E. 2558 and section 57 of the Administrative Regulations Act B.E. 2534 with approval of Prachuap Khiri Khan Province communicable disease committee meeting 14/2563 on May,16 2020 has ordered as follows:

1. Relaxation of measures for some operations or activities:

In order to facilitate the people and to move forward certain activities under the preventive measures designated by the government, including organizing and setting up proper systems, therefore, allowing the places or the activities that operated according to the order of Prachuap Khiri Khan Province No.4676/2563 dated May 16, 2020 may open for operation or carry out certain additional activities voluntarily and according to readiness as follows;

(1) Economic and livelihood activities

A. Sale of food or beverages in restaurants, food gardens, food courts, cafeterias, or general food and beverage shops, excluding pubs and bars can be opened, but consumption of alcoholic beverages in these places is still prohibited.

B. Department stores, shopping centers, community mall, to allow additional operations in respect of the distribution of consumer goods and services including food and beverage shops (consumption of alcoholic beverages in these shops is prohibited). Beauty salons, hairdressing, haircut or manicure shops, except theaters, cinemas, bowling venues, game arcades, coin-operated playing machines, skating or rollerblades venues, or other similar games, karaoke shops, amusement parks, water parks, zoos, snookers, billiards, game shops, fitness centers, fitness facilities, Thai massage establishments, foot massage, tutorial institutes, Buddha amulets places, convention centers.

In this regard, the areas and activities that are allowed to operate may refrain from competitions, organizing promotional activities or carrying out any other activities attracting a large gathering of people, and may open for operation until 8 P.M.

C. Retail stores / wholesale stores or large wholesale markets.

- D. Care facilities, residential facilities or other shelters that provide welfare to children or the elderly, or those who are dependent, can only be operated for the regular overnight stays.
- E. Filming of television programs, movies and video, which, when combined with the working group In front of the scene and every department, then there must be no more than fifty people and must not have audience participating in the program.
- F. Conference rooms in hotels or convention centers can be operated only in the case of limited number of attendees, and it is for the board meetings, shareholders' meetings trainings or seminars in which attendees come from the same organization for the convenience of verifying the source.

(2) Exercise, health care activities or recreational activities.

- A. Beauty clinics, beauty salons and manicure shops both inside and outside the malls, shopping centers or community malls can be operated only for beauty, body and skin care, excluding facial beauty treatments.
- B. Fitness centers not located inside department stores, shopping centers or community malls may open for operation only for yoga or free weights sections, while the use of exercise equipment, treadmills and stationary bikes, or group exercises shall be prohibited.
- C. Indoor exercise places or gymnasiums may open for operation only for non-contact Sports according to international rules and there shall be no audience during competition. For team sports namely badminton, sepak takraw, table tennis, squash, gymnastics, fencing and rock climbing, the number of players shall not exceed three per team.
 - D. Public swimming pools, both outdoors and indoors.
- E. Botanical Gardens, flower gardens, museums, learning centers, historic sites, archaeological sites, public libraries and art Galleries.

2. Implementation of Disease Prevention and management measures:

Owners or managers of places under Clause 1 (1) and (2) shall have the duty and responsibility of implementing disease prevention measures, as well as setting up of orderly arrangements and proper systems in accordance with recommendations, conditions and timeframes determined by the Governor of Prachuap Khiri Khan Province, Provincial Governors, or the government. Competent officials may inspect such places and give recommendations, warnings and prohibitions, or take any other actions in accordance with the law, as well as make submissions to the authorized personnel under the Communicable Diseases Act B.E. 2558 (2015) to order the temporary closure of such specific place.

In the case where the Governor of Prachuap Khiri Khan issued an order to temporarily close a place in accordance with the Communicable Diseases Act B.E. 2558 (2015), once the owner or manager of such place has implemented the measures prescribed by the government and set up orderly arrangements and proper systems, the Governor of Prachuap Khiri Khan Province or Provincial Governors, as the case may be, shall have the authority to issue an order for the reopening of such place.
